

## The ANDI Board concludes its 5th meeting, Elects a New Chairperson



African Network for Drugs and Diagnostics Innovation (ANDI) has concluded its 5<sup>th</sup> meeting in Nairobi, Kenya with the election of Dr. Tshinko Ilunga as its new Chairperson. The election of Dr. Ilunga comes as ANDI refocuses its work and rolls out a strategy for the next five year (2016 – 2020). This also comes as ANDI holds its 5<sup>th</sup> Stakeholders meeting in Nairobi with hundreds of participants from all over the world.

He highlighted that, ANDI has reached a momentum that all stakeholders would
